FOR TECHNOLOGY, EDUCATION, FINANCE AND GOVERNMENT-LIKE SECTORS:


Switch off your computers and electronics when you're not using them or enable auto-sleep options to save energy.

Print on both sides, use digital files or implement paper-free days to decrease paper usage and waste

Repair and update old equipment before buying new equipment. Once it's necessary to get rid of your old equipment, research donation or eco-friendly disposal options.

FOR TRANSPORT, TOURISM, AND AGRICULTURE-LIKE SECTORS:

Decrease pollution and curb the emission of greenhouse gasses by conserving fuel.






Adopt clean energy in tourist facilities — for example, use solar energy-saving stoves for cooking, lighting and warming bathwater. Post reminders around the facility for staff and customers to turn off lights when not in use.

Practice sustainable farming by replacing nonrenewable resources, like petroleum-based products, with rapidly renewable products and practices, such as bamboo and straw materials or solar energy.

Create a team of dedicated staff who will lead sustainability initiatives. Give incentives and recognition for staff contributions.
